

FALL 2020

Ensure park meets nearterm opportunities and future

PROJECT ON HOLD 2019 Developer not complete

• SUMMER 2020: Site available, seeded with native plants, land survey completed

• WINTER 2020-2021: **Develop construction** documents; get project bid

• SPRING-FALL 2021: Near-Term/Phase 1 Park construction


Feedback to St. Paul Parks & Recreation in December 2018

- Activation/gathering along Berry and near trailhead
- Create an esplanade/walkway
- Make sure there are trees/greenspace/plantings/vegetation
- Provide pathways into park, for accessibility
- Activating and gathering at NE corner
- Acknowledge site history lumber industry Weyerhauser
- Stormwater features, underground, developer partnerships
- Open water options
- Concern rolling mounds may not be flexible for future phase Vision park
- Unstructured play or mown paths
- Twigs/willow structures for play, nature play, small or minimal play mounds

Takeaways:

- Neighborhood needs open green space
- Park-like amenities
- Flexible area along Berry Street for gatherings or small festivals, with seating
- Leave space for future trail across Berry St.
- Allow flexibility for future park to have more amenities
- No consensus, but general preference for flat flexible lawn, maintains flexibility



VISION PLAN CONCEPTS, 2018

Feedback to St. Paul Parks & **Recreation in December 2018**

Both concepts:

- Shade but make sure it is vegetated
- Water/restroom facilities are important
- Bike trailhead facilities to Grand Round
- Park Pavilion
- Leverage employer/local partnerships, lunch crowd would use the park
- Rail re-use for play
- Space for winter use
- Space for performances

CONCEPTA

- Liked trees/greenspace/plantings/ vegetation
- Keep native planting areas, but visual break, along Emerald/west side of park


CONCEPT B

 Mounds could help amphitheater / outdoor performance venue



Takeaways:


- Community wants trees and shade, native plans and prairie restoration area
- Walking path / connection from Myrtle to Curfew - this is open now but no paved trail, do neighbors want pavement?
- Some wanted a "basic park" with intention to reserve funds for future phases/ seeding grants
- Add utility connections in initial construction phase to make future phases easier to build










ADDITIONAL PHASE 2 AMENITIES:
