Tips for clearing snow and ice:



Shovel sidewalks on all sides of your property, the full width of the sidewalk down to bare pavement, including corners, curb cuts, fire hydrants, bus stop areas.



Remove all ice from sidewalks. After the sidewalk is clear, sprinkle a little sand or salt to help prevent slipping.



If you have a corner property, please clear out all curb cuts to the street.
