Vision Statement:

Swede Hollow Park is a unique green space with a rich history located in the Dayton's Bluff and Railroad Island neighborhoods. The master plan honors the natural, historical, and cultural elements to bring awareness of its significance in the City of Saint Paul. The plan is to maintain a natural corridor for a high quality ecosystem for the wellbeing of the people, flora, fauna, and water.

Goals & Priorities

1. PARK INTERPRETATION & SIGNAGE

- + Natural, historical, & cultural stories
 - Migratory Bird Flyway, Dakota culture, Immigrants
- + Identify preferred sign locations
- + Connection to other destinations
 - Bruce Vento Nature Sanctuary, Downtown Saint Paul, East Side Heritage, Hamm Park
- + Opportunity for creative public art

2. ACCESS TO WATER

- + Daylighting Phalen Creek
- + Water quality with additional investigation on water source
- + Creative design by the water and education opportunity
- + Alternate trail type i.e. Boardwalk

3. NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

- + Removal of invasive species i.e. Buckthorns, green ashes, Siberian elm, low quality vegetation
- + Enhance wildlife habitat i.e. Rusty Patched Bumble Bee, planting native plant species

4. VISIBILITY/SAFETY

- + Lighting
- + Emergency Call-Boxes
- + Removal of low quality vegetation
- + Activating the park brings more awareness i.e. partnering with Planning & Economic Development (PED) to activate north part of the park
- + Provide equitable park access

5. SPACE

- + Provide space to gather & events
- + Spiritual/Cultural healing space
- + Activating spaces with passive recreation & programming

6. OTHER

- + Trail improvements
- + Public Art
- + Play Space

- + Enhance wildlife habitat i.e. Rusty Patched Bumble Bee, Migratory Birds

Acquire Future Property

+ Park light on bluff (active space)

+ Recommendation to acquire property, if and when, private owners decides to sell

+ Option to automatically turn off when park closes

Bluff -

- + Recommendation to remove large debris
- + Improve and stabilize slopes

Sewer Easement

Enhance Water & Wetland

- + Middle pond and lower pond are registered as National Wetlands
- + Enhance aquatic habitat for wildlife
- + Educational opportunities
- + Celebrate water natural, historical, and cultural significance
- + Water feasibility study required for either water recirculation or water filtration

South Access via 7th/Payne Ave.

- + 7th Ave Bridge is a National Historic Civil Engineering Landmark
- + Future improvements involve HPC & Bridges division
- + Jurisdiction: Public Works, Bridges Division

Public Art

- + Creative artwork to celebrate the stories of the park
- + Bring awareness to the park i.e. gateways
- + Enhance park user experience







Natural Resources Management

- + Removal of invasive and low quality vegetation.
- + Enhance wildlife habitat i.e. Rusty Patched Bumble Bee, Migratory Birds
- + Removal will most likely happen in phases. Future opportunities to coordinate and involve volunteers removal i.e. Tree Trust.
- + Target plant communities compiled by Friends of the Mississippi River in 2011.
- + Use document as a guide. More extensive work is required for site preparation when the time comes.
- + Swede Hollow Park documents are available on the project website.






NOTE: Numbers on map refer to acreages per plant community unit






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BLUFF AREA MASTER PLAN ENLARGEMENT








ADA Ramp Access

- + Paved access
- + Coordinate with HCA Building Company
- + Jurisdiction: HCA Building Company



Multi-use Overlook

- + Open view to creek
- + 1,960 SF (50' diameter)
- + Space can be used for healing, education, & celebration - design to reflect history of the park
- + Access to aggregate trails (crushed gravel)

Northern Primitive Trails

- + 3'-4' Trails (crushed gravel)
- + Creates access to creek
- + 0.19 miles of new hiking trail

Create Riffles

- + Provide a variety of water movement
- + Enhance aquatic habitat by a variety of water movement



Creek Crossings

- + Access to water
- + Interaction with water

Creek Outlet

- + Continuous water flow
- + Reduce dredging
- + Enhance water quality & habitat in middle pond

Trail Improvement

- + Approx. 4,000 SF of trail improvement
- + Capitol Region Watershed District (CRWD) recommendation to raise trail in addition with draintile to prevent water from sitting on trail surface

Bee Lawn

- + Transform approx. 39,800 SF of turf
- + Add aggregate trail for exploration & education opportunities
- + Remove large boulders
- + Open view to creek inlet
- + Enhance habitat for pollinators



Trail Improvements

+ Bituminous Trail approx. 7,200 SF

Centralized Plaza

- + Seatwalls for seating
- + 1,664 SF (46' DIA.)
- + Design idea to relate to Dakota culture



Creek Inlet

- + Open and improve view to creek
- + Close Public Works stormsewer
- + Feasibility study required for water filtration or water recirculation

Creek Confinement

+ Increase water movement & visibility
