 Contact Public Works Traffic Engineering to determine if eligible

 Organize event, fund raise, petition, get block party permit

 Submit design, maintenance agreement, completed block party permit, petition for Public Works approval



Overview of Recommendations

Administrative Changes

- Update database to allow for online renewals
- Simplify signs

System-wide Changes

- Standardize the number of permits 3 vehicle stickers and 2 visitor placards per household
- Create consistency within areas to the extent possible
- Make enforcement and use easier for everyone

Area Specific Changes

- Create consistency of time restrictions within an area, to extent possible
- Merge adjoining areas, where possible




