AWARDS PURPOSE: To recognize and promote beautification of the City through gardens, floral displays and environmental projects in order to increase horticultural knowledge.

GARDENING AWARD CATEGORIES

Business/Institutional Award - for beautifying a store front, plaza, grounds or outdoor seating in an exemplary manner.

Kern Landscaping Residential Garden Award - for residential property with exemplary landscaping and gardens.

Egg|Plant Edible Landscaping Award - for an exemplary residential or community site incorporating edible plants into the landscaping (50% or more of plants edible/herbal).

Landmark Tree Award - for remarkable trees within Saint Paul city limits

Other Awards to be given out at the Ceremony:

- Minnesota State Horticulture Society Garden Advocate Award
- Blooming Saint Paul Garden Steward Award
- Public Art Saint Paul Steward Award

- All gardens, trees and art must be in Saint Paul city limits
- All nominations on private property must be visible from the sidewalk, street or alley
- Alley gardens must have address clearly visible from alley
- Gardens maintained by the City Parks Department are not eligible
