


Introduction

The 2009 Saint Paul Police Department Crime Report contains sections describing police calls for service, department performance measures, part 1 and selected part 2 offenses, arrest totals, statistics by neighborhood, a comparison of part 1 statistics to similar cities, year-end maps for part 1 and other calls for service, and a listing of part 1 offenses by police grid.

The 2009 crime report is primarily derived from the data sent to the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension as part of the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) system. The 2009 crime report follows the FBI UCR system of reporting which requires police departments to report homicide, rape, and aggravated assault totals as the number of victims, not the number of events. Motor vehicle theft totals reflect the number of vehicles stolen. All other offense totals (robbery, burglary, theft, and arson) are reported by event. Each crime event is categorized under the incident code of the most serious offense.

Actual and reported crimes are sent to the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (<http://www.bca.state.mn.us>). Actual crimes are published by the FBI in the yearly Crime in the United States report (<http://www.fbi.gov/ucr/ucr.htm>).

The 2009 crime report is available for viewing and printing on the City of Saint Paul Internet at www.stpaul.gov. Permission is granted to print, copy, or distribute individual sections of the crime report as long as the general introduction and any corresponding section introduction pages are included.

Definitions

Reported Crime Totals – Represents the number of part 1 crimes investigated. Through investigation, some crimes may be determined to be unfounded. The reported crime total reflects this number of ‘actual’ and ‘unfounded’ crimes. Reported crime totals are only used in a comparison of part 1 crimes on page 16.

Actual Crime Totals - Actual crime totals indicate part 1 crimes that were investigated, while eliminating claims that are determined to be unfounded. Actual crime totals are used throughout this report to count part 1 offenses.

Calls for Service – Calls for Service are counted once for each time a call is made. These calls are counted regardless of whether a report is written or the complaint is baseless. Part 2 crimes are counted by call for service.

Cases – Any call for service that results in a report is counted as a case. Cases are counted once for each incident, regardless of the number of victims. Cases are used in the Performance Measures section on pages 7-14.

Calls for Service Summary

Calls for service include all requests for police assistance except for canceled calls. The final classification of a call does not always match the type of call initially received.



- Advised - the officer assisted at the situation and it did not require a report
- Detox - a citizen was transported to the detoxification center
- Gone on arrival - the persons reporting the incident and/or the persons that were the subject of the call were not present when officers arrived
- Other - a variety of uncommon dispositions
- Reports received - a written report was generated
- Service not required - no officer was needed for the call
- Traffic tag - a citation was given for the incident and no report was taken
- Unfounded - the report of the incident is false or baseless

Performance Measures

In 2009, the Saint Paul Police Department established the following set of performance measures. These measures tracked a variety of crimes, personnel evaluations, and achievements. The performance measures were tracked on a monthly basis and were collected from nearly every investigative and/or community-oriented unit in the department.

The measures were organized into four different categories: 'Reduce Gang/Gun/Drug Violence', 'Reduce Family Violence', 'Identify, Remediate, and Decrease Problem Property Crime', and also 'Celebrating and Growing Our Culture of Excellence in Service'. The measures are defined as:

Reduce Gang/Gun/Drug Violence:

"Gang, Gun and Drug violence are all interrelated. Major components of these violent activities often involve: Homicide, Aggravated and Sexual Assaults. Gangs are a response to several needs (safety, love, power, spirit, fun). Reducing these activities will have an immediate and long-term impact on the quality of life in neighborhoods and will improve the overall feeling of safety throughout the city. While enforcement will give the most immediate reduction in these three categories, a system that gives at-risk young juveniles an alternative to gang membership must be implemented to sustain long term results."

Reduce Family Violence:

"Every victim is worth fighting for and every abuser should be held accountable. Our goal is to reduce family violence through aggressive enforcement, follow-up investigations, and education for victims, families, and the public. Achievement of our goal is accomplished through community advocacy and partnerships. Family violence has a direct impact on the quality of life in every neighborhood and community in our city. Perpetrators of these crimes are also involved in other criminal activities such as drug dealing, prostitution, gang crimes, burglaries and robberies."

Identify, Remediate, and Decrease Problem Property Crime:







Shots Fired Calls




Reduce Gang/Gun/Drug Violence

Domestic Misdemeanor and Aggravated Assault Cases





Domestic Interference With 911 Cases





Violation of Order for Protection / Restraining Order Cases



Internal Affairs Complaints (Internal and External)



Rape by District



Aggravated Assault by District



Commercial Burglary by District





Residential Burglary by District





Arson by District





Quality of Life by District





Narcotics by District





Vandalism by District





Saint Paul Neighborhoods

The City of Saint Paul is divided into 17 neighborhoods, or planning districts. All statistics are derived from geocoded incidents and their location within city and neighborhood boundaries. Offenses responded to with addresses outside of neighborhood boundaries or with unknown addresses are listed as 'Other/Unknown' in the following tables.

Part 1 statistics in the following tables are 'actual offenses'. Homicide, rape, and aggravated assault offense totals are recorded in accordance with UCR guidelines which count the number of victims. Other part 1 crimes report the number of events. Part 2 crimes are a total of the calls for service. For more information, see the definitions on page 4.

This section is divided into three parts:

- 1) 2009 Saint Paul Neighborhood Statistics – Indicates crimes by neighborhood and also the calculation of crimes per 1000 residents. The 'crimes per resident' total is included so that equal comparisons can be made between neighborhoods.
- 2) 2007-2009 Saint Paul Neighborhood Statistics – These tables shows a history of crime in each of the Saint Paul neighborhoods for the last three years.
- 3) 'Saint Paul Police Grid and Planning District Boundaries' Map - This displays each neighborhood and its corresponding police grid numbers for reference. Police grids do not precisely align with planning district boundaries. This map can be used with the map on page 75 to help understand which neighborhood and/or police grid an address is in.

Part 1 Crime Total Comparison to Other Cities





Motor Vehicle Incidents Per 1000




Arson Incidents Per 1000


Saint Paul Police Part 1 Crimes (density by Grid) January 1 - December 31, 2009




















Saint Paul Police Arson Incidents (density by Grid)












Saint Paul Police Domestic GOA Calls

January 1 - December 31, 2009




