BLOOMING SAINT PAUL AWARDS

The 7th annual Blooming Saint Paul Awards ceremony will be held on January 23, 2012 at the O'Shaugnessy Educational Center Auditorium. The invitation-only affair is sponsored by the Saint Paul Pioneer Press and will be hosted by Saint Paul Parks and Recreation, the Saint Paul Garden Club and the Ramsey County Master Gardener program. Guest speaker at this years' ceremony will be public artist and Minneapolis College of Art and Design professor emeritus, Kinji Akagawa. The gardens were judged this summer by twenty five Ramsey County Master Gardeners.

Award categories include: Residential, Business/Institutional, Environmental, Art in the Garden, Public Volunteer Garden, Vegetable Garden and Gardening Advocate. Winners are announced at the ceremony and published in the Saint Paul Pioneer Press and on the Blooming Saint Paul webpage the following week.

In 2012, Blooming Saint Paul Nominations will be accepted online. Forms will be available March 1, 2012.

This fall, St. Paul Parks & Rec welcomed Katie Godfrey, a new GreenCorps member who will be working with the Arts and Gardens department for a year.

Katie is working on several the recommendations that came out of the Ramsey County Food and Nutrition Commission, including a land inventory and a community kitchen inventory. The land inventory involves creating a survey of vacant land in St. Paul that could potentially be used for community gardens and other urban

agriculture projects. Katie is working closely with the Planning and Economic Development department on this project.

A native of Madison, Wisconsin, Katie is a 2008 St. Olaf graduate with a degree in American Studies and Environmental Studies. Since graduating she has worked on several organic vegetable farms in Wisconsin. She recently helped a nonprofit called the Wormfarm Institute organize Fermentation Fest, an event that included everything from classes on fermented foods to art installations in farm fields. She hopes to continue working on projects that involve using art and food to revitalize rural and urban communities. Katie looks forward to learning more about community gardens and urban agriculture in St. Paul this year.
