





Project Overview

Other departments will also complete ADA transition plans




Plans will cover our facilities but also our services, programs, policies and communications

IMPROVEMENTS




Updated sidewalks

Safe slope for ramp from sidewalk to crosswalk




Pedestrian crossing signals that work for people with low vision



Equity Approach Overview

- The equity analysis links community engagement and ADA field evaluation to inform prioritization
- Using 3 years of ADA complaint data to inform two critical plan components:
 - Initial engagement
 - Prioritization
- This approach also builds off
 of the City of Saint Paul's pedestrian priority plan
- Building off the City of Saint Paul's pedestrian priority plan






Equity Approach: Engagement

We are looking at:

- Complaints per capita
- Complaints in high pedestrian priority areas
- Percentage of diversity compared to citywide demographics
- Disability status
- Concentrated poverty and affluence
- This will produce an equity score, which will help us understand where to prioritize ADA investments
