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## Discussion Questions for March 2, 2023

1. **What is considered competitive pay and benefits for childcare workers, and what actions can we take to ensure this is met for all workers in our program?**

*Previous Comments:*

- *We could tie dollars to paying providers at a level that mirrors K-12 educators. In terms of actions we can take... we could couple the growth of the program (i.e., scholars coming in and families being served) with an increase in the pot of money we have to pay the ECE workforce a wage that's reflective of this being a career field.*
- *Should be aligned with K-12 pay and benefits*
- *Compensation varies-often at the low end. Not sure what a competitive rate of pay is locally. Our salary range is \$20-27 hourly.*
- *I think this is an issue and that it will probably need to be solved at state or federal level. If the cost of care for the child is at market rate, that will certainly help contribute.*
- *No change in answer...*
- *\$20~\$30/ bring early childcare in alignment with school age teachers*
- *Striving for a pay scale adjacent to Saint Paul educators feels like a good goal; would be curious to see what that looks like when considering tenure, accreditation and other factors*
- *Let's look at the educators k-12 pay scale and benefits as a sample.*
- *in line with SPPS teacher salary pay scale*

2. **How do we ensure our program expands employment rather than takes away from the current childcare workforce?**

*Previous Comments:*

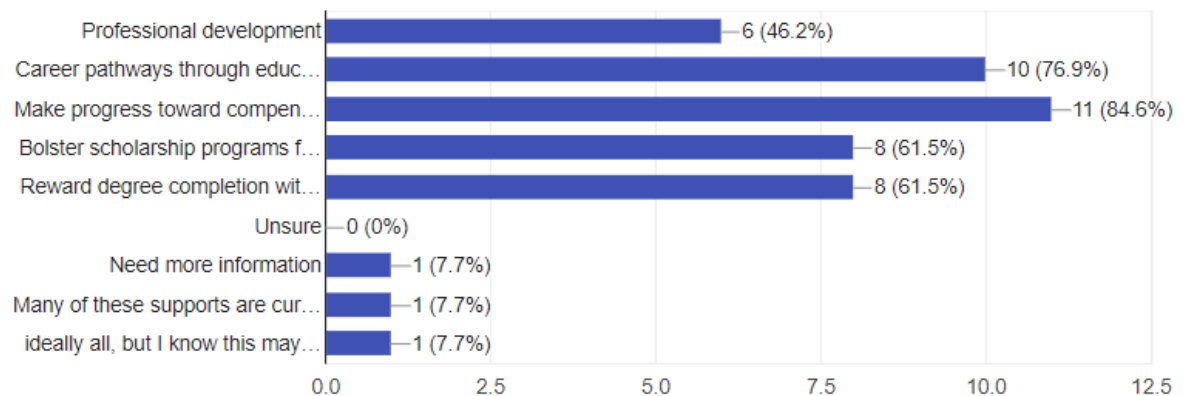
- *My hope is that folks interested in the childcare field will feel more confident to do so knowing there is a dedicated source of funding to transform the whole system over time into being more so viewed as a well-paying career.*
- *I'm not clear on what this is asking.*
- *Equitable compensation across early learning programs.*
- *I am not sure I understand- why would this program negatively effect childcare workforce? I would assume that it would actually help boost wages if it pays for cost of care*
- *I think vouchers for family choice is helpful as well as having a streamlined way for providers to get paid.*
- *Expanding pay.*

*Previous comments:*

*The early care and education program should be overseen by a Governing Board which will be responsible for meeting the legal requirements of the City of Saint Paul, both through ordinance and any contract with the City. The Governing Board should have dedicated seats for parents,*



*providers, educators, government agencies and elected officials, and be advised by a Parent/Provider Policy Council. (62.5% agree)*

- *Agree, but with edits to the size of voting member groups (more parents and providers)*
- *Add more parents and providers*
- *Support with more parents and providers on board*
- *We need parents, teachers, and providers at the table.*
- *Can't answer this without more details on the role of any governing board, and methods of accountability.*
- *I feel like this depends on the determination of the oversight*
- *It should have more providers and parents*
- *Need to see more parents - if dollars are directly given out, would still want to see a board to monitor those funds and report back.*
- *Will this board be overseeing the organization? Will this be a paid board? How does the board get out together?*
- *With an expansion 3 parents 3 providers*
- *The governing board should include the same number of parents and providers as other members in the board.*
- *But make up of board and the power it has I have questions about.*

*How should the early care and education program be held accountable for fiscal and program performance by the City of St. Paul?*

- *A governing board would be a good plan to help with this, accountability like a dashboard, and consistent info shared with councilmembers*
- *Contract with performance and fiscal expectations clearly*
- *Quartet review of progress towards performance goals*
- *The City Council should be responsible for this program, since it uses public dollars*

*The early care and education program should solicit donations from philanthropic and private sources to supplement its public funding. (25% agree)*

- *I'm concerned about strings being attached to this money*
- *That makes people accountable to people and organizations that donate.*
- *There was a lot of good conversation about this today, and I do see the reasoning behind not wanting to accept funds that have any strings attached. At the same time, I wonder if there's a way to somehow MAKE SURE there are no strings attached? It feels like we'd want to accept funds, especially some grants, that focus on early care, education, and support. I think I want to know more about the potential downsides of accepting other funds and whether there is a true, concrete way to ensure that no strings are attached to these funds.*
- *I think it creates a lot of accountability questions.*
- *Need more discussion.*
- *For general operating costs.*
- *Questions around if/how these private sources dictate how money is spent.*
- *Information that speaks to the restraints/challenges of receiving & co-mingling philanthropic and private sources to supplement public funding. What are the pros & cons?*
- *No private dollars.*
